The New York State Office of the Medicaid Inspector General (OMIG) is an independent

office within the Department of Health responsible for the Department's duties with respect to

the recovery of improperly expended Medicaid funds. PHL 31. The OMIG determined to

recover Medicaid Program overpayments from Rite Aid of New York, Inc./Eckerd Store #10825

(the Appellant). The Appellant requested a hearing pursuant to SSL 22 and former Department

of Social Services (DSS) regulations at 18 NYCRR 519.4 to review the overpayment

determination.

The OMIG's determination was communicated to the Appellant by a final audit report

(audit # 08-4287) dated August 13, 2009. Written notice of hearing in conformity with the

requirements of 18 NYCRR 519.10 was sent to the Appellant on October 29, 2009, scheduling

the hearing to commence on December 15, 2009.

The hearing was rescheduled upon the request and consent of both parties for various

reasons to January 20, March 16, 17, 18, September 21, December 7, 2010; March 8, June 7, 8,

9, November 3, 2011; January 18, 19, 20, April 11, and June 14, 2012. Neither party appeared

on June 14, 2012, nor did either party request that the hearing be rescheduled. The Appellant did

not withdraw the hearing request nor did either party advise the Bureau of Adjudication that a

settlement had been finalized.

The OMIG failed to provide a representative at the hearing to present the audit file and

summarize the case. 18 NYCRR 519.17(a). The hearing was not rescheduled and the Appellant

did not appear at the hearing on the scheduled date. 18 NYCRR 519.12(a). This administrative

proceeding is dismissed. 18 NYCRR 519.11, 519.12, 519.17.
