Work Conducted in 2016

ADOPTION

In 2016, the Codes Committee recommended and the Council subsequently approved for adoption nine regulatory proposals. These adopted regulations improve oversight to ensure health and safety, expand access to services, and create consistency between New York State regulations and federal regulations.

Subpart 7-2 of Title 10 New York Codes Rules and Regulations (NYCRR) – Children’s Camps – This regulation implements requirements of the New York State Protection of People with Special Needs Act, which specifies children’s camps for children with developmental disabilities as a type of facility within the oversight of the Justice Center. Prior to adoption, these protections were implemented under an emergency regulation.

Part 300 of Title 10 NYCRR – Statewide Health Information Network for New York – The new Part 300 of Title 10 gives the Department regulatory oversight over the Statewide Health Information Network for New York (SHIN-NY).

Part 23 of Title 10 NYCRR – Sexually Transmitted Diseases (STDs) – The adopted amendments to Part 23 of Title 10 create consistency with changes to Public Health Law (PHL) section 2304, which was amended as part of the enacted 2013-14 budget.

New sections 405.33 and 752-1.6 of Title 10 NYCRR – Extended Mammography Hours for General Hospitals and Hospital Extension Clinics – These new regulations require mammography providers to offer extended hours of operation.

Amendment of Section 700.2 and Parts 717, 793 and 794 of Title 10 NYCRR – Hospice Operational Rules – The adopted amendments make state operational rules for hospice consistent with federal regulations, among other provisions.

Parts 763 and 766 of Title 10 NYCRR – Home Care Agencies to Obtain Written Medical Orders from Physicians – The adopted amendments make state regulations for certified home health agencies consistent with federal regulations and make state regulations for licensed home care services agencies consistent with regulations for certified home health agencies with regard to the timeframe for obtaining signed physician orders.

Sections 22.3 and 22.9 of Title 10 NYCRR – Supplementary Reports of Certain Birth Defects for Epidemiological Surveillance – The adopted amendments update when and how individuals are reported to the New York Birth Defects Monitoring Program, formerly named the Congenital Malformations Registry.

Part 4 of Title 10 NYCRR – Protection Against Legionella – The new Part 4 of Title 10 related to cooling towers establishes requirements for the registration, testing, cleaning and disinfection, maintenance, inspection, certification, recordkeeping, and reporting of results and actions in order to control the growth of *Legionella* bacteria. Prior to adoption, these protections were implemented under an emergency regulation.

Section 415.41 to Title 10 NYCRR – Specialized Programs for Residents with Neurodegenerative Diseases – This new regulation establishes criteria for nursing home specialty units that offer services and facilities for individuals with Neurodegenerative Diseases, meaning Huntington’s Disease and Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis.

REGULATORY PROPOSALS FOR INFORMATION

In 2016, the Codes Committee reviewed the following proposals presented for information, which were undergoing or had recently completed the public comment period.

Sections 23.1 and 23.2 of Title 10 NYCRR – Expansion of Minor Consent for HIV Treatment Access and Prevention – This proposal would amend Sections 23.1 and 23.2 of Title 10 to add HIV to the current list of sexually transmitted diseases and provides minors the ability to consent to HIV prevention, treatment and services.

Part 405 of Title 10 NYCRR – Federal Conditions of Participation – This proposal would amend Part 405 to incorporate federal Conditions of Participation regarding telemedicine, authentication of medical records, integrating the nursing care plan into the overall disciplinary plan of care, and patient self-medication while in the hospital.

REGULATORY PROPOSALS FOR DISCUSSION

In 2016, the following proposal was discussed by the Codes Committee:

Addition of Part 350 to Title 10 NYCRR – All Payer Database – This proposal would create a new Part 350 of Title 10 New York Codes, Rules and Regulations pertaining to the All Payer Database, referred to as the “APD.” The APD will collect and contain public and private health care claims and encounter data and will help answer important questions for consumers, business owners and policy makers. It will be a key resource for supporting finance policy, quality measurement, and population health and health care system comparisons and improvements. This proposal is needed to implement and operate the APD. A Notice of Proposed Rulemaking is being prepared for publication in the New York State Register.

Work Conducted in 2016

Charity Care Reporting Compliance for Approved Ambulatory Surgery Centers (ASC)

Subdivision (d) of 10 NYCRR section 709.5 lists a written policy to provide charity care and documentation of enhanced access to the underserved among the factors that *shall* be considered in determining public need for Ambulatory Surgery Services. This is the Department’s basis for monitoring and enforcing the applicant’s charity care and Medicaid targets during the limited life period through annual reporting. Work Conducted in 2016

During 2016, under the leadership of John Ruge, M.D. the Committee on Health Planning continued its comprehensive review of potential changes to the residential health care facility bed need methodology. At its January and March meetings, the Committee completed discussions that began in 2015, which included stakeholder input, regarding potential changes to the need methodology for nursing homes set forth in regulation at 10 NYCRR § 709.3.

The Committee recommended a series of changes: revising the methodology for a five-year period from 2016 to 2021 with 2016 as the planning target year, collecting data and reevaluating the need for the methodology during the intervening period of time, revising the base year to 2014 and trending use data, employ a more flexible construct that starts with counties but permits flexibility in defining the planning area, adjusting the use of migration data and revising the occupancy rate threshold. At the April meeting, based on the Committee's work, the PHHPC voted to recommend these changes to the Department of Health. The Department is currently developing regulations to incorporate the recommended revisions.

In 2016, the Committee also embarked on a joint effort with the Committee on Public Health to identify ways to facilitate the integration of primary care and behavioral health services and promote local collaboration of primary care providers, public health leaders and other stakeholders to act on broad determinants of health.

The Committees met jointly on several occasions. In July, the Committees heard from state staff from the Department of Health, the Office of Mental Health (OMH) and the Office of Alcoholism and Substance Abuse Services (OASAS), who provided updates on various state programs and initiatives, including the Delivery System Reform Incentive Payment (DSRIP) Program, the State Health Innovation Plan/State Innovation Model (SHIP/SIM), and the Integrated Outpatient Services regulations issued by the agencies. In September, the Committees again met in a joint session and heard from representatives of organizations that have been working on integrating primary and behavioral health care as well as those who are addressing broad determinants of health in their primary care services.

Subsequently, the Committees identified a preliminary set of potential recommendations for the Council on ways to further serve the goals of promoting the integration of primary care and behavioral health and the integration of social determinants into primary care in communities throughout the state. These recommendations were presented to the PHHPC on December 8, 2016. The Committees are developing a report that will present an overview of the issues and opportunities in these areas, along with specific recommendations, to be issued in 2017.

Additionally, the Committee recommended one applicant for Stroke Center designation to the PHHPC during 2016.

Work Conducted in 2016

In 2016, the Public Health Committee, under the leadership of Jo Ivey Boufford, Chairperson, continued its support of the implementation of the *Prevention Agenda 2013-18*, New York State’s health improvement plan, completed a report on maternal mortality and ways that the Committee could address it in an effort to “move the needle” on a major public health concern in NYS, and partnered with the Health Planning Committee of the Council to focus attention on the social determinants of health.

The goal of the state’s Prevention Agenda is to improve health status and reduce health disparities in five priority areas. In 2016 the Public Health Committee and the Ad Hoc Committee to Lead the Prevention Agenda co-hosted with the Department a one-day meeting that brought together over 200 people from local health departments and hospitals to discuss local community health improvement efforts tied to the Prevention Agenda. In the fall, the committees met with Deputy Secretary for Health Paul Francis and Commissioner of Health Howard Zucker to discuss the importance of expanding the Prevention Agenda to include an explicit focus on Health in All Policies. HiAP is a collaborative approach to incorporate health considerations into policy making and programming across sectors and policy areas to improve the health of the community. Work on Health in All Policies will occur in 2017. Reducing maternal mortality and its significant disparities is a goal the committee adopted to bring attention to a Prevention Agenda priority and to move the need on this issue. Over the past two years, the committee has hosted discussions focused on “pre-hospital” strategies including bringing attention to the importance of integrating preconception and interconception care in

routine outpatient care for women of reproductive age. A final report on the series of meetings and recommendations for improvement was adopted by the Committee at its February 2016 meeting. In the future, the Committee will be represented in the newly established *New York State Partnership for Maternal Health* that includes the New York State and New York City Departments of Health, the New York State American Congress of Obstetricians and Gynecologists, and the hospital associations in the state. This group will collaborate on efforts to improve care for women and reduce maternal mortality.

Finally, the Public Health Committee partnered with the Health Planning Committee to review NYS initiatives that facilitate the integration of primary and behavioral services and could incorporate considerations related to public health and social determinants into primary care. The committees held two meetings to learn about successes and identify challenges by hearing from organizations that have implemented/begun implementing the respective programs. A report summarizing the findings and identifying recommendations to facilitate implementation of these initiatives will be released in 2017.
