
2023 World AIDS Day and Ending the Epidemic (ETE) Summit: Post-Event Evaluation Results

All respondents agreed that the staff were Helpful or Very Helpful




Both events were rated as Very Organized by over 80% of respondents

"The youth voices on living with HIV and those using PrEP"




AIDS Memorial Quilt
