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About

The New York State (NYS) Hepatitis C (HCV) Navigation Program aims to increase the number of people who inject drugs (PWID) who know their HCV status and are linked to medical care and treatment.

This program is part of New York State's strategy to eliminate HCV.

What is HCV Navigation?

HCV Navigation is a comprehensive intervention that provides outreach to PWID, HCV testing, linkage to HCV care and treatment, support to address barriers to care, and reinfection prevention.

How Can I Access Navigation Services?

Contact the Navigation Program in your area for assistance. HCV Navigators will perform outreach and conduct HCV testing in high-impact settings such as syringe exchange programs, local jails, and homeless shelters, to identify individuals living with HCV. Individuals with HCV are then linked to care to start HCV treatment and achieve a cure.
