

Building Youth & Family Engagement: Supporting Collaborative Practice with the CANS-NY

The NYS Department of Health, the CANS-NY Technical and Training Institute and Chapin Hall at the University of Chicago would like to announce the availability of a four-hour, in-person training for Care Managers and their Supervisors on **Building Youth & Family Engagement: Supporting Collaborative Practice with the CANS-NY**.

The CANS-NY is a tool designed to support deeply collaborative practice from assessment to care planning to progress monitoring. The training will emphasize practice, role-play, and experiential understanding of youth and family engagement strategies, including the use of outreach contacts to develop engagement and begin assessment, an understanding of the importance of the assessment process in complex care coordination, and the ability to build a shared understanding of the purpose of the CANS-NY to youth and families during the assessment and care planning process. Strategies for using the CANS-NY action levels to develop a shared vision with youth and family, to negotiate disagreement and build consensus, and to talk about sensitive topics with youth and family will be presented and practiced. Throughout the training, a range of strategies to build, track, and sustain engagement with youth and their caregivers will be learned by participants.
