NEW YORK SIM UPDATES:

- **NEW!** A solicitation for a Communications Consultant has been posted and can be viewed here. The Consultant will support the SIM initiative through development and implementation of a communications strategy intended to educate and inform health care providers, payers and consumers of the benefits of this new care delivery model and of how this new care delivery model aligns with and supports numerous emerging health policies, programs and initiatives. Report on Diabetes in New York State

The Office of Budget and Policy Analysis released a report outlining diabetes across the state. Described by the State Health Innovation Plan as "arguably our biggest looming health challenge", diabetes is diagnosed to around 1.6 million adults in New York each year alone. The costs associated with the increasing prevalence of this deadly disease are cause for great concern. To read the detailed analysis, a full version of the report can be found here.

Kaiser Family Foundation 2015 Employer Health Benefits Survey

An annual survey analyzing employer-sponsored health coverage was released in September. The survey was conducted by the Kaiser Family Foundation and the Health Research & Educational Trust and compiled almost 2,000 interviews with private and non-federal public firms. A main finding was a four percent increase in the average premiums for employer-sponsored family health coverage since the previous year. To read the full report, click here.
